* Mount nesting boxes by mid-March, with the base of the box about 4 to 5 feet above the ground.
* Do not change the size of the entrance: 11/2 inches is correct for bluebirds.
* If you paint or stain the box, use a light color only on the outside of the box
* A bluebird box should never have a perch. Sparrows and wrens are attracted to

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perches
* Bluebirds prefer large lawns with short grasses because they feed primarily on insects found on the ground.
* Try to place boxes at least 100 feet away from woods or thick brush.
* To help eliminate competition from tree swallows, locate two boxes about 5 feet apart.

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
