The Hudson Estuary Trees for Tribs Program helps to protect and restore streamside buffers. Healthy buffers, composed of native trees, shrubs, and grasses, help to:

- Reduce water pollution
- Reduce erosion and flooding damage
- Provide habitat for fish and other wildlife

How Does the Program Work?

Trees for Tribs offers free native trees and shrubs for qualifying planting projects in the Hudson River estuary watershed. Program staff may be able to assist with plant selection, designing a planting plan, and other technical assistance to help your project succeed.

How Do I Apply?

If you own or manage property near a stream in the Hudson estuary watershed, you can apply for assistance from Trees for Tribs. Applicants must complete an application, and if the project is selected, recruit volunteers for planting, and maintain the site after planting is complete.
